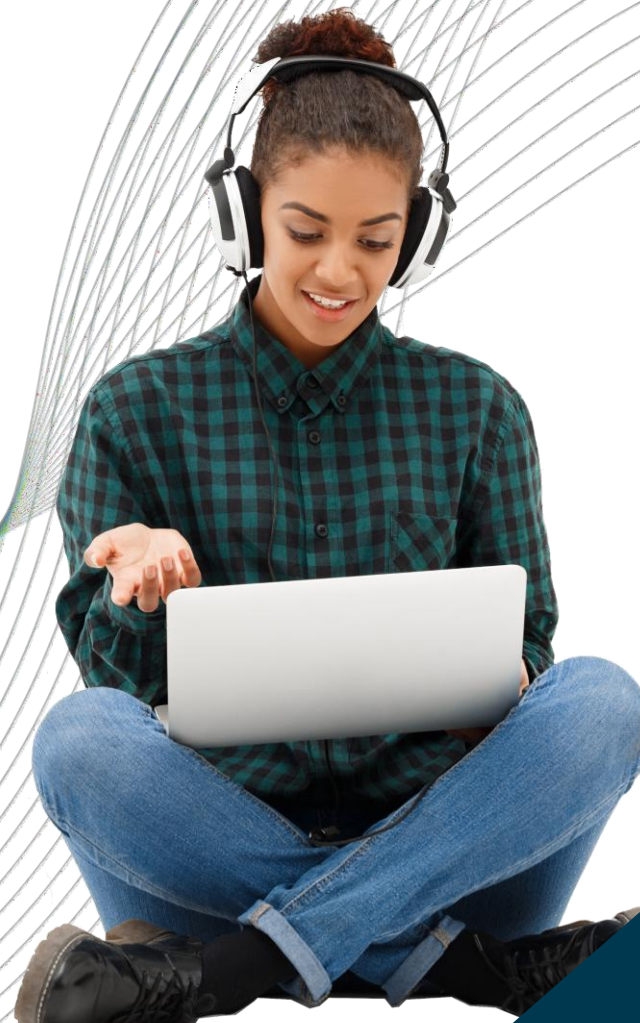























Word / Expression	Explanation + Example sentence	French Translation	Illustration
<b>Hi!</b>	Informal greeting. <i>Hi! How are you?</i>	Salut !	
<b>Hello</b>	Standard greeting. <i>Hello, my name is Anna.</i>	Bonjour	
<b>Hey</b>	Casual greeting. <i>Hey! What's up?</i>	Salut	
<b>Good morning</b>	Greeting in the morning. <i>Good morning, teacher.</i>	Bonjour (le matin)	
<b>Good afternoon</b>	Greeting in the afternoon. <i>Good afternoon, everyone.</i>	Bonjour (après-midi)	
<b>Good evening</b>	Greeting in the evening. <i>Good evening, sir.</i>	Bonsoir	
<b>Good night</b>	Used before going to sleep. <i>Good night, Mom.</i>	Bonne nuit	
<b>How are you?</b>	To ask about someone's feelings. <i>Hi! How are you?</i>	Comment vas-tu ?	
<b>I'm fine.</b>	Positive answer. <i>I'm fine, thank you.</i>	Je vais bien.	
<b>I'm good.</b>	Another positive answer. <i>I'm good today.</i>	Ça va bien.	

<b>I'm okay.</b>	Neutral answer. <i>I'm okay, thanks.</i>	Ça va.	
<b>I'm tired.</b>	To say you need rest. <i>I'm tired after work.</i>	Je suis fatigué.	
<b>I'm happy.</b>	To show good mood. <i>I'm happy today.</i>	Je suis heureux.	
<b>I'm sad.</b>	To show bad mood. <i>I'm sad today.</i>	Je suis triste.	
<b>I'm angry.</b>	To show you are upset. <i>I'm angry with my brother.</i>	Je suis fâché.	
<b>I'm sick.</b>	To say you don't feel well. <i>I'm sick today.</i>	Je suis malade.	
<b>Thank you</b>	To say thanks. <i>Thank you very much.</i>	Merci	
<b>Thanks</b>	Informal way of saying thank you. <i>Thanks for your help.</i>	Merci	
<b>You're welcome</b>	Polite reply to thanks. — <i>Thank you!</i> — <i>You're welcome.</i>	De rien	
<b>Please</b>	To be polite. <i>Please sit down.</i>	S'il vous plaît	

<b>Excuse me</b>	To get attention. <i>Excuse me, where is the bus?</i>	Excusez-moi	
<b>Sorry</b>	To say you regret something. <i>Sorry, I'm late.</i>	Désolé	
<b>Yes</b>	To agree. <i>Yes, I do.</i>	Oui	
<b>No</b>	To disagree. <i>No, thank you.</i>	Non	
<b>Maybe</b>	Not sure. <i>Maybe tomorrow.</i>	Peut-être	
<b>What's your name?</b>	To ask someone's name. <i>Hi! What's your name?</i>	Comment tu t'appelles ?	
<b>My name is...</b>	To say your name. <i>My name is Alex.</i>	Je m'appelle...	
<b>Nice to meet you</b>	Polite when you meet someone. <i>Nice to meet you, Paul.</i>	Enchanté	
<b>How old are you?</b>	To ask about age. <i>How old are you?</i>	Quel âge as-tu ?	
<b>I'm ... years old.</b>	To say your age. <i>I'm 15 years old.</i>	J'ai ... ans	

<b>Where are you from?</b>	To ask about origin. <i>Where are you from?</i>	D'où viens-tu ?	
<b>I'm from...</b>	To say your country. <i>I'm from France.</i>	Je viens de...	
<b>See you!</b>	To say goodbye. <i>See you later!</i>	À bientôt !	
<b>See you later</b>	To say goodbye for a short time. <i>See you later at school.</i>	À plus tard	
<b>Goodbye</b>	Formal way to leave. <i>Goodbye, teacher.</i>	Au revoir	
<b>Bye</b>	Informal goodbye. <i>Bye, John!</i>	Salut (au revoir)	
<b>Take care</b>	Friendly goodbye. <i>Bye, take care!</i>	Prends soin de toi	
<b>Have a nice day</b>	Polite wish. <i>Have a nice day, sir.</i>	Bonne journée	
<b>What's up?</b>	Informal greeting. <i>Hey! What's up?</i>	Ça va ? / Quoi de neuf ?	
<b>Not much</b>	Answer to <i>What's up?</i> . — <i>What's up?</i> — <i>Not much.</i>	Pas grand-chose	

<b>Fine, thanks</b>	Polite short answer. <i>I'm fine, thanks.</i>	Bien, merci	
<b>And you?</b>	To ask back. <i>I'm fine. And you?</i>	Et toi ?	
<b>Where do you live?</b>	To ask about place. <i>Where do you live?</i>	Où habites-tu ?	
<b>I live in...</b>	To say your city. <i>I live in Paris.</i>	J'habite à...	
<b>Friend</b>	Someone you like. <i>My friend is nice.</i>	Ami	
<b>Teacher</b>	A person who teaches. <i>My teacher is kind.</i>	Professeur	
<b>Student</b>	A person who studies. <i>I am a student.</i>	Étudiant	
<b>Family</b>	Parents, brothers, sisters. <i>My family is big.</i>	Famille	
<b>Classmate</b>	A person in your class. <i>My classmate is helpful.</i>	Camarade de classe
